


# THE BROWNS




Three Browns, distinct in expression and taste,

the rest.


But why are they like






The High Brow allows

to be processed.




The Middle Brow

process pop.




And poor Low Brow




High Brow's Capitals  
give it that distinctive look.




Middle Brow can't


Yes, our trio seems quite happy ... well, maybe they don't look very happy but at least

It all seems pretty set in stone,




